@roberta_artview was conceived as a curatorial space dedicated to contemporary art, envisioned as a site of active exchange between images, language, and community. The project is grounded in the belief that art should not be reduced to a purely spectacular experience or to a superficial mode of visual consumption, but should instead reclaim its role as a space for thought, inquiry, and transformation. Through writing, image-based narration, and critical reflection, this space activates a conscious dialogue in which the artwork is not simplified, but becomes a generative site for questions, resonances, and the redefinition of perception.

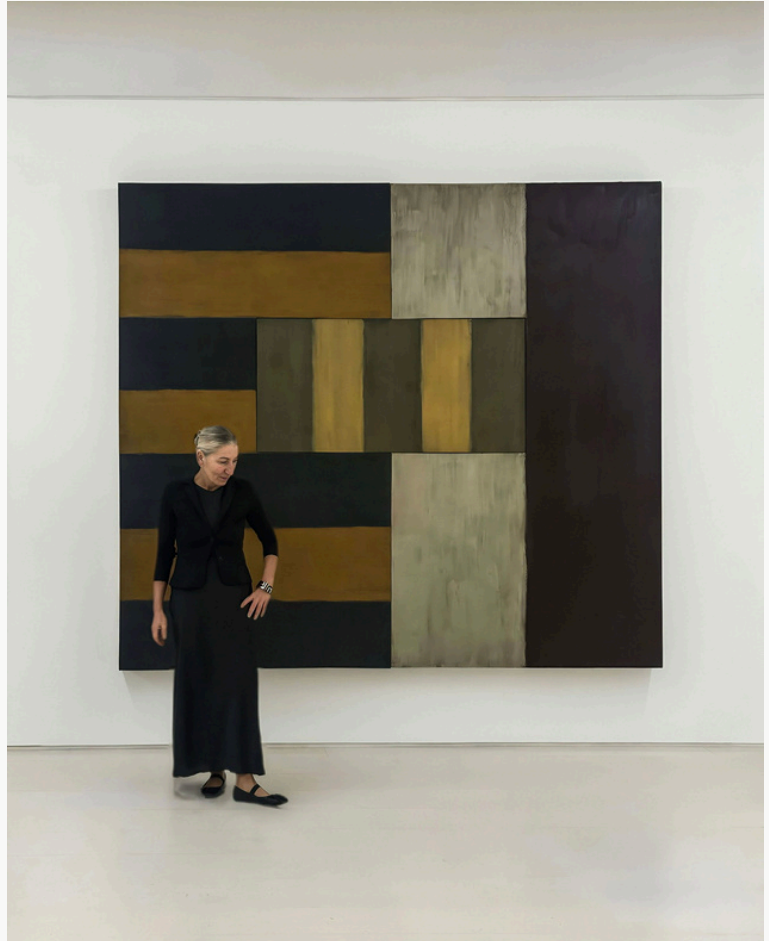

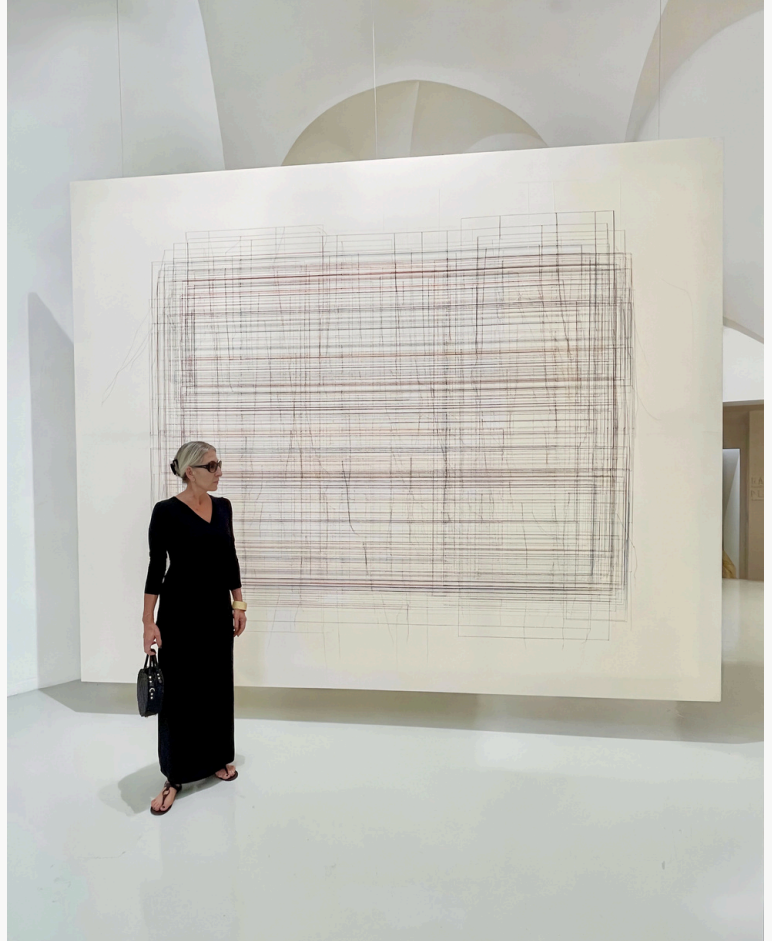
SEAN SCULLY

A curatorial reportage dedicated to Sean Scully's installation-based painting, with a focus on the relationship between color, structure, and architectural space. The visual and textual narrative presented the work as a perceptual and temporal experience, rather than as a finished object.

The post reached 74,887 views, with 2,821 likes and 391 comments, indicating a high level of organic engagement. The content also generated 797 profile actions, highlighting strong user interaction.

A curatorial reportage dedicated to Shilpa Gupta's installation, with a focus on drawing as a political gesture and on the redefinition of boundaries between language, structure, and freedom. The visual and textual narrative presents the work as a space of tension and inquiry, rather than as a resolved form.

The post reached 86,456 views, with 2,829 likes and 268 comments, confirming a high level of organic engagement. The content also generated 1,401 profile actions, indicating strong audience activation.

International Institutional Recognition

In October 2025, Roberta Bertozzi received a formal letter of appreciation from Murat Ülker, Chairman of the Board of pladis and GODIVA, a leading figure in the international cultural and entrepreneurial landscape and a supporter of the cultural initiative connected to the work of Ahmet Güneştekin.

The recognition was conferred on the occasion of the exhibition YOKTUNUZ, hosted at the National Gallery of Modern and Contemporary Art in Rome.

In the letter, Ülker highlights the critical quality and interpretive depth of Bertozzi's contribution, emphasizing her ability to read modernity and to articulate the dialogue between classical and contemporary art within an institutional museum context of international significance.
